



April 1917 – Lenin returns
Nov 1917 – Oct Revolution
Dec 1917 – armistice
(USSR & Central Powers)
March 1918 – Treaty of Brest-L
Aug 1918 - \$6 billion marks

1933 – 2nd Five Year Plan




Stalin and the USSR

1936-38 – The Great Purge

Statistics: October 1936–November 1938

**3 of 5 Field Marshals
13 of 15 army commanders
8 of 9 admirals
50 of 57 army corps commanders
154 of 186 division commanders**



Stalin and the USSR

1936-38 – The Great Purge

Statistics: October 1936–November 1938

At least 1,710,000 people were arrested.

At least 1,440,000 people were sentenced.

At least 724,000 people were executed.

Among other cases in October 1936-November 1938:

At least 400,000 people were sentenced to labor camps by Police Troikas
as *Socially Harmful Elements*

At least 200,000 people were exiled or deported by "Administrative
procedures".

At least two million people were sentenced by courts for common crimes;
among them 800,000 were sentenced to GULAG camps.



Disintegration of the USSR


1985 – General Secretary Mikhail Gorbachev

Union of Soviet Socialist Republics**


