Philip II of Spain (r. 1556-1598)

Father – Charles V – Holy Roman Emperor Mother - Isabella of Portugal

Wives- Maria Manuela of Portugal (16)
Mary I of England (while Queen)
Elizabeth of Valois (14)


Anna of Austria (21)

500% inflation (4% for 44 years)
Inherited massive debt
Bankrupt 4 times between 1556 & 1596

Attacks Ottoman naval force at Djerba, Tunisia.

Decisive Defeat for Spain and Holy League





Decisive Defeat for Spain and Holy League

1571
Holy League
Defeats Ottoman naval
force at battle of Lepanto.

Ends Ottoman dominance of Mediterranean

Dutch Revolt

Prelude to 30 years war

1572 – 1585 (de facto independence)



Seventeen Providences (low countries)
In conflict with Spain over:

Taxation - Religion - Centralization

Spanish Armada -1588

"Great and Most Fortunate Navy"


Transport 55,000 men to invade England (30,000 already in Spanish Netherlands).

22 warships, 108 armed merchant ships 50% more firepower

"Hellburners"

Defeats Armada at Graveline

Pursues to latitude of Firth of Forth

Queen Elizabeth at Tilbury

I know I have the body of a weak and feeble woman; but I have the heart and stomach of a king — and of a King of England too, and think foul scorn that Parma or Spain, or any prince of Europe, should dare to invade the borders of my realm





Chapter 15 – From War to International Crisis

The Thirty Years' War (1618-1648)

Begins over religion in Bohemia

Second Defenestration of Prague

Catholics order Protestants to stop building chapels 3 Catholic regents thrown from 3rd story window Land in pile of manure – all survive



War spreads – calls for help from Spain and Ottomans Aims shift from religion to politics (Habsburgs) French Huguenots are suppressed by King Louis XIII

Chapter 15 – From War to International Crisis

The Thirty Years' War (1618-1648)

Ends with Gustavus Adolphus of Sweden leading protestant forces to victory



Chapter 15 – From War to International Crisis

Peace of Westphalia - 1648

A series of treaties forming a comprehensive peace. Representatives of 109 "interested parties"

Results:

Boundaries begin to create "Nation-States" Rights of minority religions to worship
