Articles from *History Today* or *PLOS ONE* will not be approved.


Late approvals will be penalized 5 points.

Reviews of unapproved articles will be penalized 10 points.


If the unapproved article was approved for another student it will be penalized an additional 10 points.


## IONIAN REVOLT

- Persia took control of all Greek city-states along coast of Asia Minor in 547 BC
  - Region known as Ionia
- Ionian city-states rebelled against Persian rule in 499 BC
  - Sought aid from mainland Greece
    - Only Athens and Eretria responded
    - This aid allowed Ionian city-states to put up fierce resistance to Persians
      - But revolt was nonetheless defeated by 494 BC

## Invasion of Greece

Pheidippides had been sent to Sparta to request that the Spartan army march to the aid of Athens.

the Athenian army marched quickly to block the two exits from the plain of Marathon, and prevent the Persians moving inland


Persians sailed here.

Pheidippides arrived during the festival of Carneia, a sacrosanct period of peace, and was informed that the Spartan army could not march to war until the full moon rose
