
First Carolingian king

50% faster longer workday eat oats, not just grass



Agricultural Innovations Three-Field System


Older method was 2 field rotation WHEAT / FALLOW

Field 1: Wheat and Rye

Field 2: Barley, Oats, Peas & Beans

Field 3: fallow / pasture

Viking siege of Paris – 885-6


700 ships & 30,000 men Charles the Fat

Viking raids on Seine River since 820.


Paid 5,000 livres by Charles the Bald in 876

Nobles Nobles

Nobles were vassals of kings and queens. Many were also lords of lowerranking nobles and knights.

Kings and Queens Kings and queens were the greatest lords of Europe, and all nobles and knights were their vassals.



Knights

Knights served their noble lords in exchange for land.



Peasants

Peasants owned no land, so they were not part of the feudal system. But many peasants worked on land owned by nobles or knights.
