
First Carolingian king



50% faster longer workday eat oats, not just grass



Agricultural Innovations Three-Field System


Older method was 2 field rotation WHEAT / FALLOW

Field 1: Wheat and Rye

Field 2: Barley, Oats, Peas & Beans

Field 3: fallow / pasture


Increased urban population created a market for excess crops

Viking siege of Paris – 885-6


700 ships & 30,000 men Charles the Fat

Feudalism


lay (and clerical) elite

Vassal = Celtic for "servant"

Homage = "Homme" - man

Fief = grant of land, etc. (rhymes with leaf)

In democracy it's your vote that counts;
In feudalism it's your count that votes








Manorialism


economic organization
