


Church Architecture Romanesque






Church Architecture Gothic

The Norman Conquest (1066)


The creation of England as we know it.



Battle of Hastings

Harald Hardrada and Tostig (Bro. of Harold) defeated at Battle of Stamford Bridge.

Harold returns to south the defend against William the bastard/conqueror





Battle of Hastings


Norman archers not effective.

English shieldwall holds against infantry and cavalry.

Normand left breaks and runs. English loose disciple and pursue.

William and knights counter-attack with success. Orders archers to fire "indirect" over shieldwall.

Harold hit in eye, William charges through line and Harold is killed.







The Norman Empire

At its greatest extent ca. 1380 AD

Status: Composite Monarchy

Informal Empire

Ruling Dynasty: House of Normandy

Falaise, Normandy Capital:

- Baldwin IV inherits Sicily

Languages: Latin (official), Norman French, Old

French, Middle English, Old Catalan, Old Sicilian, Arabic, Zarphatic, others

1230 AD

Religion: Catholic (official), Greek Orthodox,

Sunni Islam, Judaism

Historical Era: Middle Ages - Norman Conquest of England 1066 AD - Norman Conquest of Italy ca. 1000 - 1200 AD - William III inherits Aquitaine 1143 AD - Norman Crusade 1193-1202 AD

William of Normandy


King of England & Duke of Normandy (vassal to King of France)
