
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Civic Humanism

"Politics have no relation to morals."


"Wisdom consists of knowing how to distinguish the nature of trouble, and in choosing the lesser evil."

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





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Gutenberg Bible


42 lines/page 1,282 pages

150 paper 35 parchment/vellum (6,000 calves)





