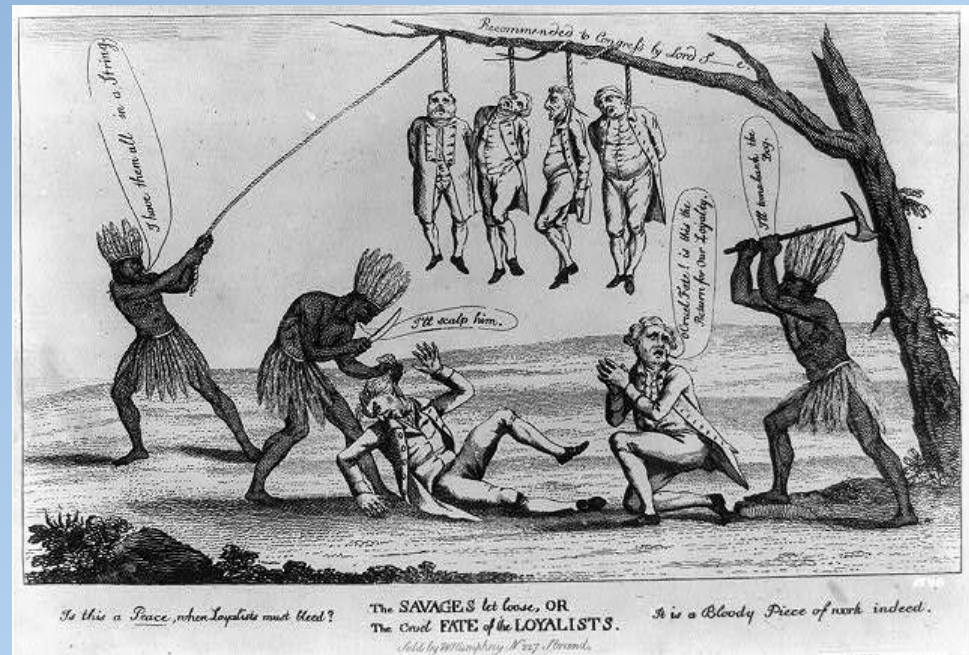

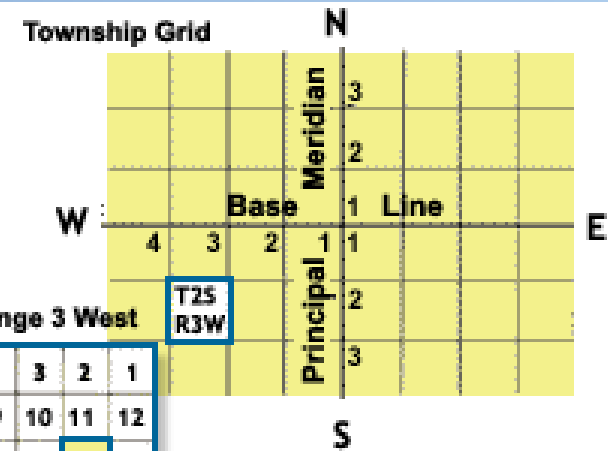

640 acres

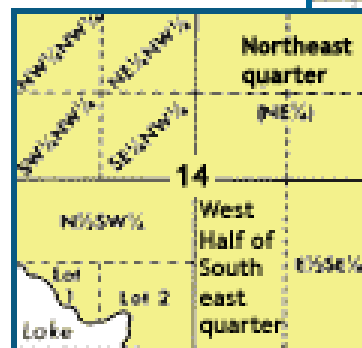
Public Land Survey System (PLSS)

Section 14 shows both normal division of the section into aliquot parts and the fractional division into government lots.

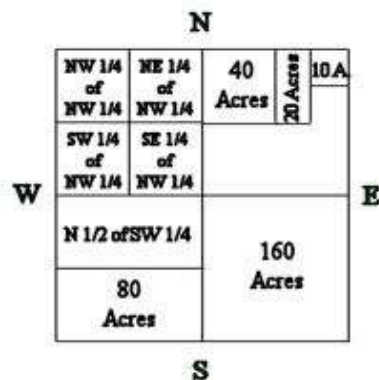


Diagram of a section of land, 640 acres
